A message from Linda Calder, Development Manager

Welcome to our first newsletter for 2018.

There have been so many highlights since our last newsletter – the biggest being our **Annual Funding Round**. This year we were delighted to distribute \$121,500 to 47 groups throughout the Hawke's Bay community – our largest distribution yet.

More than 100 donors and recipients came together at our Annual Giving event, held at the Hastings Community Arts Centre in November. This was a fantastic opportunity to celebrate our community and congratulate the hard-working charities that make our patch a better one to live in.

None of this would be possible without our wonderful donors and we have been blessed to receive funds from a number of new donors, who see HBF as a safe pair of hands. One of our objectives is to foster a generous community, which in turn makes our region better for everyone.

In conjunction with Harcourt's Hawke's Bay Arts Festival, we launched our first special interest fund - the **Arts Fund**. This was seed-funded by four generous donors, with further donations from 132 people who attended the festival, bringing the total to an impressive \$26,000.

We have launched our **new website**, thanks to generous sponsorship from NZ Digital. We are also incredibly grateful to Band who has continued to support us with their design expertise.

2018 is shaping up to be another great year that will see our fund continue to grow and give back to Hawke's Bay forever.

Thank you for helping us create an incredible backbone for future generations, simply by sharing and living the 'Live Here, Give Here' values and philosophy.

The event was described as 'the community looking after the community' and that is exactly what it was.

In November, we had our annual 'Giving Event', our only event of the year where we invite both donors and those that do all the hard work and are successful recipients. This year we celebrated funding on behalf of our donors and the tinnal Foundation \$121,500 to 47 local community groups across Hawke's Bay. It was a special evening as it recognised the diverse groups that work so hard in our community and gave our donors a chance to thank them in person for all their hard work.

Every year we invite a different group along to entertain the crowd and this year we were wowed by the extremely talented children from the Orokohanga Music Trust who displayed their talent with the violins and cellos. They completely stole the show!

Over the past five years the foundation has distributed over half a million dollars of funding to more than 150 local organisations. By living here and giving here our donors really do make a difference.



Our biggest year of giving back yet.

The Hawke's Bay Foundation's sixth annual funding round concluded at the end of last year, with 47 grants made to local community groups and charities with \$121,500 distributed.

The funding distribution included funds from the Tindall Foundation which, through the Hawke's Bay Foundation, focuses on supporting families and social services.

Each year applications for funding are assessed by a Distributions Committee chaired by Sarah Mulcahy, HBF Trustee, who said, "While we were delighted to be able to give out over \$112,000 in grants to local community organisations in this round, the applications we received were almost three times more than previous years. We must keep building the Foundation so that we can make larger distributions in the future, and really support these grassroots organisations who constantly work to make a difference in our region."

A new fund for CHB

We are delighted to have Andrea Barry and her family join our growing group of donors who have recently started a fund with the Foundation.

We asked Andrea what motivated her to set up a fund with HBF. "For some time I'd been looking at ways the Barry family and BEL Group could get involved and give something back to support our community. Having been invited to view a presentation locally by the Hawke's Bay Foundation, I came away convinced this would make the perfect partnership opportunity.

The HBF runs a well thought out and proven business model where the grantee organisations are chosen by a panel of trusted advisers with the community knowledge to know who, what and where the greatest needs are. We know that our donation makes a difference. Dodgy, fake charities are weeded out.

And I like the model of giving where the gift benefits many and the legacy can keep growing through the generations. We can choose to keep adding annually to our donation or take a break ... regardless the donation keeps giving.

Also, I was able to target specific areas that had meaning to us, whether it was within education, youth, sport etc., and I could also target the specific geographical location that gained the benefit from our gift, for example, Central Hawke's Bay.

The second generation of the Barry family was all born in the Waikato; however they have all grown up and been educated within Hawke's Bay, so this is our home community. The HBF credo to 'Live Here, Give Here' is a statement that really resonates with us and means we are making a legacy here that will last forever.

Launch of the Arts Fund

Our first dedicated special interest fund was launched in August with the purpose of injecting money into the local arts community to ensure that our creative talents throughout the region continue to be nurtured and supported.

Hawke's Bay has an incredibly vibrant arts community with great depth of talent, so this fund will provide specific funding at a grassroots level to give them a leg up to become sustainable on their own.

Four incredibly generous donors seeded the fund and the Harcourts HB Arts Festival supported the fund by adding a donation button to their site during the festival and through this we had a further 132 donations, so we are delighted to launch our Arts Fund with over \$26,000. This means that we will be able to start distributing funds this year which is absolutely phenomenal.

This year the grant will help them support their existing programmes in Napier and expand their social work, youth programmes & counselling into CHB which allows them to strengthen their work with families. Napier Family Centre really try to collaborate with other similar services so that they don't duplicate what is already happening in the community.

We hold a number of Tea @ 10 events throughout the year. These are small, informal events where we invite supporters to come and hear from one of the local organisations. They are not only a lot of fun but can also result in donations – a win/win as we have happy donors who know where their dollar is going and very happy charities that have to work so hard for funding.
